Dear Friends,

During January we marked the national holiday for the birthday of Martin Luther King Jr. The focus of that service included a remembrance of one of Dr. King's most memorable and stirring pieces of writing, the "Letter from Birmingham Jail". This letter was written on scraps of paper during his time of imprisonment in jail in Birmingham, Alabama. It is one of his most enduring pieces of writing that beautifully summarized the civil rights struggle in this country.

In February the women of our church marked Black History Month by reading stirring words that women of color have penned during the long and continuing struggle for justice. The words that were read were written out of the blood, sweat and tears that informed their writings over long decades, of the bitter history of righting the wrongs of slavery, oppression and Jim Crow. Part of that service included a dramatic recital of the poem, "And Still I Rise" by Maya Angelou, presented by our own Farrah Howard. I draw your attention to this poem not only because of the power of Ms. Angelou's words, but also because this past week as I watched a documentary style film that highlighted the life of this remarkable woman.

Thinking about these reflections over these past Sundays, recalls for me the fruits of the spirit that the Apostle Paul speaks of in Galatians 5:22; "love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such, there is no law."
